

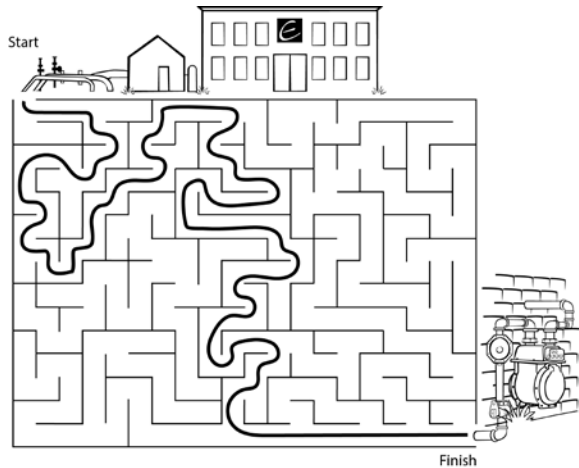

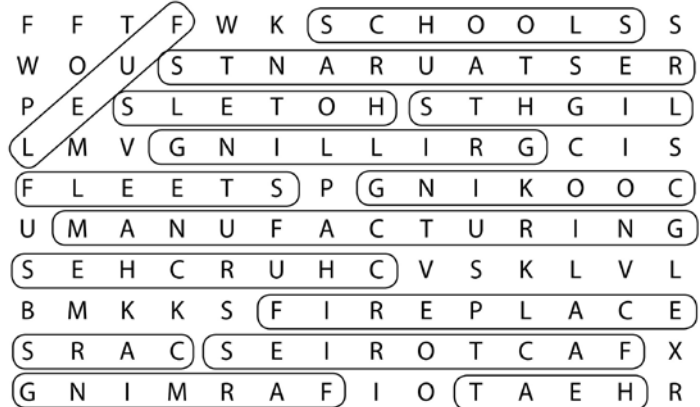

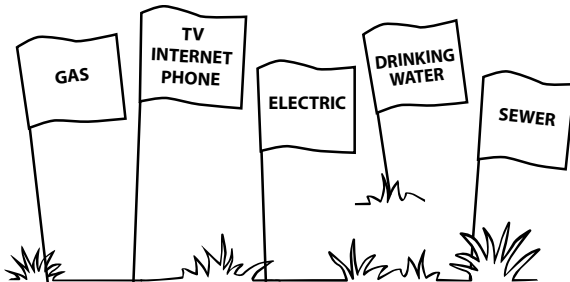
### Page 3) How Do We Get Natural Gas?



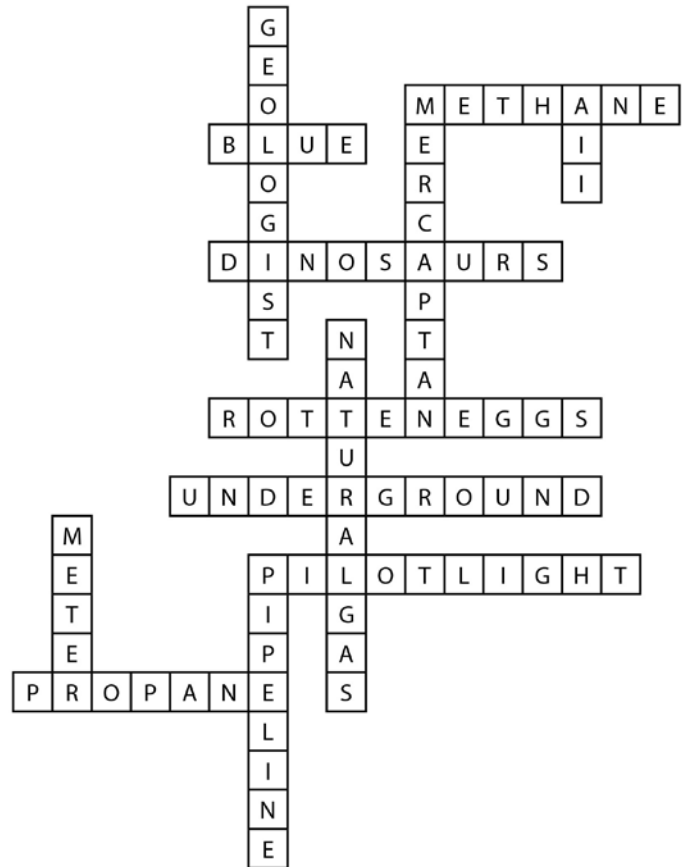

### Page 6) Can You Smell Natural Gas?

- True** - If all of a sudden you smell rotten eggs inside your house, you should leave the house and find an adult to tell.
- False** - If you do smell rotten eggs, move outside and as far away from the house as possible to stay safe. Then tell an adult so that they can call Jackson Energy Authority to come check it out. Do not go back inside until the gas serviceman from Jackson Energy Authority says it's okay.
- True** - If you do smell the stinky rotten egg smell, do not use a cell phone or regular phone and do not flip on a switch inside the house. Move outside.
- True** - If you are outside playing and all of a sudden smell rotten eggs or see dirt blowing up from the ground, it could be natural gas. Move away from the area, find an adult and have them call Jackson Energy Authority.
