

HELP KEEP THE WASTEWATER PIPES & SYSTEM FREE OF DEBRIS

THE TOILET IS NOT A TRASH CAN!

Putting anything in the toilet other than human waste or toilet paper can cause blockages and major damage to the wastewater pipes and system.

NO CAT LITTER OR GRAVEL

Cat litter, even that labeled "flushable," aquarium gravel or earth gravel builds up in the system, causing clogs.



NO WIPES OF ANY KIND

Whether for cleaning, removing makeup, babies or personal hygiene, disposable wipes should not be flushed. Even though packaging is labeled "flushable" these don't break down but wad up, catching other debris in the system.



NO PERSONAL HYGIENE ITEMS

Dental floss, cotton swabs, cotton balls, feminine products, condoms, whitening strips, bandages, hair, etc. should be thrown in the trash can.



NO BAGS, RAGS, DIAPERS OR PAPER TOWELS



NO PHARMACEUTICALS OR PILLS

Medications should always be taken to the local drop box for safe disposal. Throw old vitamins in the trash.

NO FATS, OILS & GREASE

Meat fats and juices, lard, shortening, cooking oils, butter, margarine, sauces, dressings, baking goods, gravies, dairy products, etc. are sources of grease for the trash can not the sink.



NO FOOD SCRAPS



Use sink strainers in drains to catch food scraps to throw into the trash can.

NO PRODUCE STICKERS, SEEDS, STEMS, ETC.
