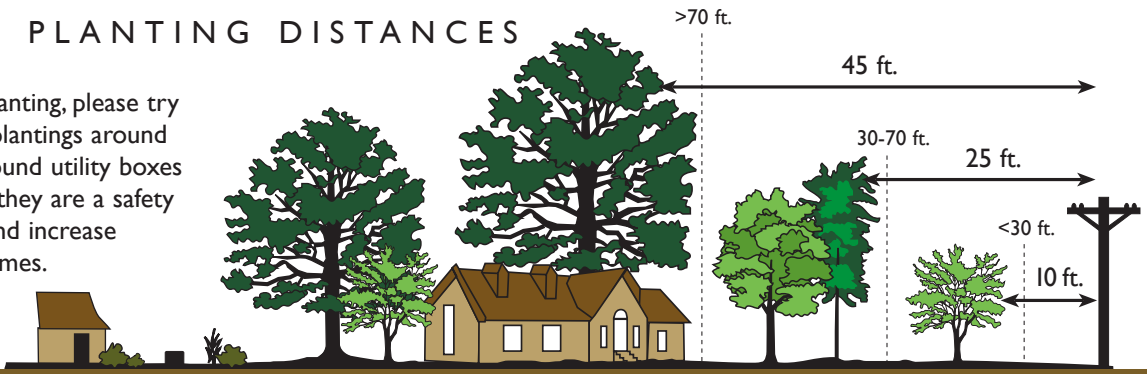

# TREE PLANTING DISTANCES

When planting, please try to limit plantings around underground utility boxes because they are a safety hazard and increase outage times.



## SMALL

### LESS THAN 30 FEET AT MATURITY

These trees tend to be very beautiful trees for small yards (less than an acre). They need to be planted at least 10 feet from the utility lines.

## MEDIUM

### FROM 30 – 70 FEET AT MATURITY

These trees tend to be well suited for shade trees and should be used in backyards. They need to be planted at least 25 ft away from the utility lines.

## LARGE

### MORE THAN 70 FEET AT MATURITY

These tree are only suited for the largest yards (larger than 1 acre). They need to be planted at least 45 ft. from utility lines.

American Beech	Cottonwood*	Sugar Maple
Bald Cypress	Loblolly Pine	Sycamore*
Black Cherry	Shumard Oak	White Oak
Black Walnut	Southern Magnolia	Yellow Poplar

*\*Not good for allergies.*



## TREES TO RECONSIDER BEFORE PLANTING

These tree have problems in our landscapes. Some are fast growing, which leads to weak wood and breaking problems, some reproduce easily which leads to weedy trees, or they are very prone to disease and insect problems.
