


>70 ft. TREE PLANTING DISTANCES 45 ft When planting, please try to limit plantings around 30-70 ft. 25 ft. underground utility boxes because they are a safety hazard and increase outage times. 10 ft.

## **SMALL**

#### LESS THAN 3 0 FEET AT MATURITY

These trees tend to be very beautiful trees for small yards (less than an acre). They need to be planted at least 10 feet from the utility lines.

# **MEDIUM**

## FROM 30 - 70 FEET AT MATURITY

These trees tend to be well suited for shade trees and should be used in backyards. They need to be planted at least 25 ft away from the utility lines.

### LARGE

#### MORE THAN 70 FEET AT MATURITY

These tree are only suited for the largest yards (larger than I acre). They need to be planted at least 45 ft. from utility lines.

American Beech **Bald Cypress** Black Cherry Black Walnut

Cottonwood\* **Loblolly Pine** Shumard Oak Southern Magnolia

Sugar Maple Sycamore\* White Oak Yellow Poplar

\*Not good for allergies.



#### RECONSIDER BEFORE PLANTING TREES TO

These tree have problems in our landscapes. Some are fast growing, which leads to weak wood and breaking problems, some reproduce easily which leads to weedy trees, or they are very prone to disease and insect problems.
